This program is intended for students who are available to participate in the full schedule. If you have **any** prior summer commitments and would be unavailable at **any** point from **July 1 – July 31, 2024**, you will be asked to list each date in the next section.

IMPORTANT: Submit your completed application and supporting documents (listed below) to MOED_employment@moed.uscourts.gov. You may type directly into this document, save it to your machine, then email it. Do not email without saving first. Please note that your application is not complete until this office receives the supporting documents listed below:

- 1) Your college transcript;
- 2) One letter of recommendation from either a professor or other counselor at your college; and
- 3) Your resume.

All applications and supporting documents must be received no later than Friday, February 23, 2024.

FELLOWSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

This fellowship is a four-week commitment. Every Fellow is expected to be present each day, Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, for the duration of the fellowship. The four weeks will begin on Monday, July 1, 2024, and end Wednesday, July 31, 2024; and excludes July 4 and 5, 2024.
